Founded in 1991 by teachers in response to a competitive grant, International School believes confidence comes from competence and our curriculum is designed to challenge students to learn at high levels even in subject areas that prove challenging. Elements of our program that support this:

- Students are required to take 7 years of Science, Math, Humanities, and International Studies.
- Students are required to take 6-7 years of World Language, Fine Arts, and PE.
- Depth of learning & development of persistence, including in traditionally non-academic areas.
- Beginning in junior year, students may choose among math and science courses but must take one of each. Students may also choose to take Computer Science beginning in junior year.
- Nearly all course sequences end with an Advanced Placement course.
- International's small size and 7 year program fosters interpersonal relationships with both peers and faculty. Our culture promotes collaboration, friendship and mutual respect amongst diverse viewpoints.

Unique Features of International School

Admission

All students enroll by choice. Admission is by lottery without regard to financial or scholastic ability. Lottery is held for 5th graders with approximately 89 students admitted out of an applicant pool of 700+

Enrollment Class of 2020: 65

The International School is a public school, with 28% of students speaking a first language other than English, and 5% qualifying for free and reduced-price lunch. All students enroll by choice. Total enrollment of 587.

Curriculum

Students are required to complete 6-7 years of study in 7 subject areas in order to achieve mastery. Subjects are: Math, Science, Fine Arts, PE, International Studies, Humanities, and French. The use of technology is integrated throughout all courses.

Senior Project

Each senior must create, coordinate and complete a Senior Project. These student driven projects tap into the student's unique intellectual curiosities and involve connecting outside the school community, an extensive research paper, a culminating portfolio presentation, and a speech to a panel of adults. A minimum of 50 hours is required outside of school. *Examples include: 3D printed prosthetic hand, bee keeping, building a hydrogen fuel cell, homeless youth advocacy, music composition & performance, and watershed restoration.*

Advancement Placement

AP Classes offered are listed below. Though 14 courses are offered, due to our course plan, the max the majority of students can take is 8 with the possible addition of Fine Arts and/or Computer Science.

AP Classes Offered: Biology; Calculus AB; Chemistry; Computer Science; Computer Science Principles; Studio Art; English Language; English Literature; Environmental Science; French; Physics 1; Physics 2; US History; World History.

Assessment System

- International School does not weight grades or assign class rank.
- Students earn an A (4.0), B (3.0), C (2.0) or F (0.0). In keeping with our goal of mastery, students do not earn credit with a D grade.
- A grade of S = Satisfactory and does not calculate into GPA.
