Autism Spectrum Navigators provides advocacy, access, and educational services to autistic students at Bellevue College pursuing their choice of degrees and /or/ certificates. ASN celebrates the unique personality of each student, and respects their right to make individual choices regarding their educational path. ASN is a program of the R.I.S.E. Learning Institute and Center for Career Connections.

Designed according to the social justice and diversity models of disability, ASN provides autistic students with educational opportunities for strengths-based self-knowledge in the four program areas of focus: **Self-Advocacy, Self-Regulation, Social Interaction, and Executive Functioning**; increasing their personal ability to access academics, campus services, and community and career options. ASN works with the campus and the greater community to improve accessibility to areas of college life and beyond, including academics, working with others, socializing, and being a part of the community.

Advocacy and Access Services:

- ◆ Orientation with Cohort prior to beginning of first quarter
- ◆ Regular Meetings with trained peer mentor (Navigation Assistant)
- ◆ Supported communication with faculty & advisors; supported access to services & programs

Academics: A (usually transferable) credit class taken with cohort each quarter, for eight quarters.
