RESPONSIBILITY, OPPORTUNITY, ADVOCACY, & RESPECT

Eligibility Criteria

- A desire to attend College
- Not able to enroll in a "traditional" college
- Responsible & socially adaptive
- Willing & able to live communally & independently
- 4th-grade reading level & basic mathematics skills

Types of Support

- Advising and individualized career guidance
- Navigation across campus & Pullman community
- Same-aged peer support (e.g., classes, social experiences)
- Life skills, vocational skills, and social skills development
- Internship & Employment Coaching

On Campus Living

- At the Chinook Village Apartments
- 3 or 4 bedroom apartment
- Living with other ROAR students (roommates)
- Assistive Living Advisors: on-call for questions or emergencies

Other Information

- Cost: Approximately \$22,983 plus individual living expenses
- Cost includes WSU fees, Program fees, and housing-rent
- No out-of-state tuition/fees
- 2-year program at a 4-year public university
- Culminates in a Certificate of Completion - NOT a Degree or Diploma from WSU
